

This gives students practical experience in financial forensic analysis.

As of the 2025–2026 academic year, the Justice for Fraud Victims Project is active in 12 affiliate colleges across the United States, a 50% growth over the 2024-2025 academic year.

Partner with organizations to provide resources to JFVP affiliate schools, such as software, hardware, and expert services such as crypto tracing and open-source intelligence investigations.










Develop partnerships with law enforcement agencies to fuel referrals of fraud cases to JFVP affiliate schools.
